WHO SHOULD PARTICIPATE?

Tribes with connections to coastal and marine environments will find value in attending the Tribal Ocean Summit. Tribal citizens and their representatives who are responsible for ocean, coastal, and marine resource management will gain insights about their work and the work of other Tribes. Tribes will have the opportunity to learn about and discuss meaningful consultation processes with BOEM. The organizers encourage a variety of professionals to attend, including:

- Tribal council
- Elders and other Tribal leaders
- Tribal Historic Preservation Officers, archaeologists, natural resource managers and other experts
- Employees and staff working for Tribes, and other Tribal representatives or their designees.

BOEM will gain insights in ocean management and the work of Tribes. BOEM participants will learn how to improve interactions and consultations with Tribes. The organizers encourage a number of professionals to attend, including:

- Bureau leaders and decision makers
 Tribal and community liaisons, and Historic
 Preservation Officers
- Natural resource managers, environmental analysts, leasing specialists, archaeologists, sociocultural specialists, other experts.
