

BOEM Issues a Notice of Intent to Prepare an Environmental Impact Statement and an Opportunity for Scoping Comments for the Proposed Gulf of Mexico OCS Oil and Gas Lease Sales for 2017-2022

The Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) shall offer for oil and gas leasing approximately 131 million acres of the approximately 160 million acres in the Gulf of Mexico (GOM), with the exception of the whole and partial blocks within the boundary of the Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary, the blocks deferred by the Gulf of Mexico Security Act of 2006, the blocks that are beyond the United States' Exclusive Economic Zone in the area known as the northern portion of the Eastern Gap, and the blocks under Congressional moratoria. Although the leasing of portions of the GOM (subareas or blocks) can be deferred during a Five-Year Program, the Department of the Interior is conservative throughout the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process and includes the total area within the GOM for environmental evaluation.

BOEM published in the April 29, 2015, *Federal Register*, a Notice of Intent (NOI) to Prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The NOI seeks input on the scope of the 2017-2022 GOM Multisale EIS for proposed GOM Lease Sales 249, 250, 251, 252, 253, 254, 256, 257, 259, and 261.

In lieu of participation in the public scoping meetings listed above, all interested parties, including Federal, State, Tribal, and local governments, and the general public, may submit written comments on the scope of the 2017-2022 GOM Multisale EIS, significant issues that should be addressed, alternatives that should be considered, and the types of oil and gas activities of interest in the proposed lease sale areas.

Written comments should be received within 30 days following the publication of the notice in the *Federal Register* in one of the following ways:

BOEM makes all comments, including the names and addresses of respondents, available for public review during regular business hours. If you wish your name and/or address to be withheld, you must state your preference prominently at the beginning of your comment. All submissions from organizations or businesses and from individuals identifying themselves as representatives or officials of organizations or businesses will be made available for public inspection in their entirety.
