MMS HONORED AGAIN FOR QUALITY IMPROVEMENT (#40054)

The Department of the Interior's Minerals Management Service (MMS) was honored today when its Royalty Management Program (RMP) was named a 1994 Quality Improvement Prototype Award Finalist for the second consecutive year.

Vice President Al Gore present the annual awards to recipients at the Seventh Annual National Conference on Federal Quality, in Washington, DC, at luncheon ceremonies.

Jimmy Mayberry, a Deputy Associate Director for the Royalty Management Program, attended the ceremony as MMS' principal representative.

Sponsored by the Federal Quality Institute and the President's Council on Management Improvement, the Award recognizes federal agencies for their efforts toward total quality management.
