

What is the Status of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Section 106 consultation for the New England Wind Project?

- 1. BOEM has delineated the Area of Potential Effect (APE) for terrestrial archaeology, marine archaeology, and visual effects to historic properties.
- 2. BOEM has made a Finding of Adverse Effect that identifies adverse effects to:
- Gay Head Lighthouse;
- Edwin Vanderhoop Homestead (Aquinnah Cultural Center);
- Gay Head–Aquinnah Shops Area;
- Nantucket Historic District National Historic Landmark (Nantucket District NHL);
- Chappaquiddick Island traditional cultural property (TCP);
- Moshup's Bridge and Vineyard Sound TCP;
- Nantucket Sound TCP, including 19 ancient submerged landform features that contribute to the TCP; and
- 33 ancient submerged landform features on the Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) outside of these TCPs.
- 3. BOEM distributed cultural resource technical reports to consulting parties and is facilitating consulting party meetings for Section 106 consultation.
- 4. The Draft EIS includes a draft Finding of Effect, BOEM's proposed mitigation measures, and a Draft Memorandum of Agreement.

What are the Next Steps for NHPA Section 106 Consultation?


- 1. Receive input on the draft Finding of Effect and Memorandum of Agreement.
- 2. Facilitate additional consulting party meetings to resolve adverse effects.
- 3. BOEM and consulting parties finalize and execute the Memorandum of Agreement.
- 4. BOEM documents binding mitigation in the Record of Decision for New England Wind.




