

Introduction

We collected the data in this volume as appendices to a study of the economy of Alaska's North Slope Borough for the Minerals Management Service's Social and Economic Studies Program. Our purpose in presenting these data is to provide a reference volume which may be useful to the North Slope Borough as well as to other researchers.

The data collected here are from a variety of sources. Among the most important sources are the 1980 U.S. Census, Alaska Department of Labor publications, surveys conducted in 1980 and 1982 by Alaska Consultants, Inc., and North Slope Borough publications. Almost all of the information has been previously published, and in many cases, we have simply reproduced the data from the original source. All credit for these data should go to the original sources. We take responsibility for any errors in our presentation of these data.

Except for Barrow, most missing data is evenly distributed among the other villages across different age groups. This means the average incomes for these other villages are within the standard errors reported.

However, Barrow represents a unique case, since it has a larger percentage of young people than the other villages: those 18-24 are more apt not to know their household income than other adults. Yet, the majority of those 55 or older who did not answer the income questions also live in Barrow. The counterparts of these two groups-those of similar ages, but who reported their income-generally have household incomes below the average for each year. After finding that total months all household members worked correlates highest with reported income, we assigned Barrow missing data the mean incomes of Barrow households with similar work patterns. As such, Barrow income represents estimated income, while all other villages represent reported income.
