A regional Stakeholders Task Force established to advise the U.S. Department of the Interior on the next 5-Year Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) leasing schedule will meet January 4-5, 1995 in Anchorage. The Task Force was established by the OCS Policy Committee to advise the Committee and the Interior Department's Minerals Management Service (MMS) on the next 5-Year Leasing Plan in Alaska. Recommendations from the task force will be used by MMS when developing that portion of the 1997-2002 5-Year Natural Gas and Oil Program for federal waters offshore Alaska.
