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Initiating the Environmental Review Process

- Scoping:
 - Publish Notice of Intent (NOI) to Prepare an Environmental Assessment (EA) in the Federal Register
 - 30 day comment period
 - Hold scoping meeting
- The NOI requests interested and affected parties to identify:
 - Issues and alternatives to be considered in the EA
 - Potential mitigation measures
 - Sources of information relevant to the analysis
- BOEM will also use the scoping process to identify and eliminate issues that are not significant or issues that have been analyzed by prior environmental reviews.



Environmental Assessment

Next Steps:

- Prepare EA with cooperating agencies and consider public input
 - Cooperating agencies are those with "jurisdiction by law or special expertise" per the Council on Environment Quality
- Publish EA for public review
 - Publish Notice of Availability (NOA) of EA in Federal Register
 - 30 day comment period
- BOEM will consider public comments on the EA to determine whether to issue a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI), or conduct additional analysis under NEPA.
- BOEM will determine to approve, approve with modifications or disapprove the research activities plan.

Analysis of Socioeconomic Conditions

- Vessel Traffic
- Commercial and recreational fishing activities
- Cultural resources
- Recreational resources
- Demographic and employment
- Environmental justice
- Land use and coastal infrastructure
- Other uses of the area



Analysis of Cumulative Impacts

- Past, present, and reasonably foreseeable future actions:
 - Maritime traffic
 - Existing port and waterway usage
 - Onshore development
 - Other renewable energy activities
 - Other proposed projects (e.g. Virginia commercial lease)



Environmental Consultations

- National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA)
- Government-to-Government Consultations
- Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA)
- Endangered Species Act (ESA)
- Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (Essential Fish Habitat)
- Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA)
- Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA)
