



Advanced Technology Demonstration Project Locations




Determination of Competitive Interest and leasing process:

Competitive

- BOEM prepares & publishes a Call for Information (CALL)
- Proposed Sale Notice
- Final Sale Notice
- Lease Sale / Auction
- Lease award

Non-competitive

- BOEM prepares &
 publishes a
 Determination of No
 Competitive Interest
 (DNCI)
- Proposed applicant may submit plans to BOEM for the project



DoD Activities & Stipulations:

Site specific stipulations:

Wind projects in certain areas may have impact on military activities and DoD may request that BOEM add stipulations to the lease agreement to mitigate impacts; e.g., a requirement for the developer to coordinate major construction activities with DoD to avoid conflicting use during large fleet training exercises.

Indications of Interest:

- Response procedure described in 30 CFR 585.213
- Potential applicants submit an application to BOEM as described in the RFI
 - (1) Statement of interest in proposed lease area
 - (2) Description of project and facilities
 - (3) General schedule of activities leading to commercial development
 - (4) Information & data on renewable energy resources and environmental conditions in the area
 - (5) Demonstration of legal qualifications
 - (6) technical and financial capability

Requested Information from Interested & Affected Parties

BOEM also requests from the public and other interested or affected parties specific and detailed comments regarding:

- 1. Geological and geophysical conditions
- 2. Historic properties
- 3. Multiple Uses of the area
- 4. Relevant environmental information
- 5. Socioeconomic information

Protection of Privileged or Confidential Information:

- Freedom of Information Act
 - Exemption 4 of FOIA applies to trade secrets and commercial or financial information that is privileged or confidential
- National Historic Preservation Act
 - Section 304
 - BOEM will withhold the location, character and ownership of historic resources may cause any harm

What will BOEM do with information provided from a RFI?

- Determine if competitive interest exists
- Further identify and refine the lease area
- Develop options for environmental analysis
- Solicit public input on potential environmental consequences
- Prepare for future National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) analysis
- Share the comments and information with the Task Force
