These evacuations are equivalent to 3.66% of 819 manned platforms and 8.76% of 137 rigs currently operating in the GOM.

This shut-in oil production is equivalent to 0.86% of daily production of oil in GOM, which is currently approximately 1.5 million BOPD.

This shut-in gas production is equivalent to 0.59% of the daily production of gas in the GOM, which is currently approximately 10.0 BCFPD.
