- Provide two or three examples of EJ findings within Louisiana.
- Discuss a "collaborate" approach to the EIS process grounded in community and stakeholder involvement.
- Briefly discuss the results of a National Park Service research project that addressed some of these topics.
- Provide a methodological overview for addressing EJ, including a critique of current EPA/NOAA reliance on surveys from the "American Community Data".
