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## Executive Summary

TotalEnergies Carolina Long Bay, LLC (“TotalEnergies”), has developed this Progress Report (“Report”) to comply with lease Addendum C Section 3.1 and is organized by audience-specific and activity-related sections: Section 2.0, Tribal Engagement, Section 3.0, Engagement with Potentially Affected Parties, and Section 4.0, Survey Plan Activities. The progress reports document ongoing engagement activities from the early stages of project development and foster transparency in the process.

TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp, a direct affiliate of Duke Energy (Cinergy Corp.)<sup>1</sup>, owner of the adjacent Lease Area OCS-A 0546, have agreed to hold joint outreach meetings when possible as the projects advance per lease stipulation 3.1.3.

Overview of actions since last Progress Report:

- TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp. provided project updates to state and federal agencies via a Quarter 2 and 3 – 2024 email outreach.
- TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp provided project updates to Federally Recognized Tribes and Non-Federally Recognized Tribes via a Quarter 2 and 3 – 2024 email outreach.
- TotalEnergies engaged with various industry groups including American Clean Power Association, Oceantic, Southeastern Wind Coalition, and the North Carolina Sustainable Energy Association.
- TotalEnergies continued engagement with local fishermen, local leaders and community groups.

## **1.0 PURPOSE AND BACKGROUND**

### **1.1 Progress Report Purpose**

TotalEnergies Carolina Long Bay, LLC (“TotalEnergies”), has developed this Progress Report (“Report”) to comply with lease Addendum C Section 3.1, which requires a progress report every six months (or as Bureau of Ocean Energy Management [“BOEM”] otherwise directs) through the site assessment term that includes a brief narrative of engagement since the last progress report, which was submitted June 1, 2024.

The progress reports document ongoing engagement activities from the early stages of project development and foster transparency in the process. At this early stage of the project, many discussions are introductory in nature and are designed as a starting point to establish relationships with a wide array of stakeholders. As these relationships progress, TotalEnergies will have ongoing opportunities to seek advanced input on specific project elements and will take that feedback into consideration for project planning and design.

If BOEM provides comments on the progress report (within 60 calendar days from receipt), TotalEnergies will address comments and modify the progress report.

### **1.2 Lessee Information**

TotalEnergies is the leaseholder of the Lease Area OCS-A 0545 (“OCS-A 0545 – TotalEnergies Carolina Long Bay, LLC”), where TotalEnergies proposes to construct and operate a wind energy generation facility called TotalEnergies Carolina Long Bay (“TE-CLBay” or “Project”). TotalEnergies is part of a global multi-energy company, TotalEnergies SE, that produces and markets energy. TotalEnergies SE has a 15-gigawatt (“GW”) offshore wind development portfolio globally and made its debut into the U.S. offshore wind market via BOEM’s New York Bight (“NYB”) 2022 lease auction, where rights were obtained for developing the Attentive Energy Project. TotalEnergies subsequently participated in the BOEM Carolina Long Bay lease auction in May 2022 and obtained rights for Lease Area OCS-A 0545 – TotalEnergies Carolina Long Bay, LLC.

### **1.3 Lease Description**




Figure 1-1. Lease Area OCS-A 0545 - TotalEnergies Carolina Long Bay, LLC, and Lease Area OCS-A 0546 – Cinergy Corp

Lease Area OCS-A 0545 – TotalEnergies Carolina Long Bay, LLC, is a 54,937-acre area located on the outer continental shelf (OCS) approximately 22 statute miles from the coast of North Carolina. The adjacent Lease Area OCS-A 0546 is owned by Cinergy Corp, a direct affiliate of Duke Energy (Cinergy Corp.)<sup>2</sup>. A map of the Lease Areas is shown in Figure 1-1.

## 2.0 TRIBAL ENGAGEMENT

### 2.1 Overall Tribal Engagement Progress Since Last Report

BOEM's lease stipulations 3.1.1 and 3.1.2 require TotalEnergies to engage with federally recognized Tribes that have historical and cultural ties to Lease OCS-A 0545 – TotalEnergies Carolina Long Bay, LLC, and to prepare a Native American Tribes Communication Plan (NATCP). Per BOEM's guidance, TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp. are carrying out joint engagement with the Tribes – starting with a joint Tribal Engagement Survey sent in November 2022 and are developing a single NATCP covering both projects. Both TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp. have elected to also engage with Non-Federally Recognized Tribes, recognizing the importance of allowing all Native American peoples with historical and cultural ties to the area an opportunity to share their perspectives, opinions, concerns, and recommendations during development of the Project. TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp. have contracted with SEARCH, Inc, (SEARCH) to provide a single Tribal Liaison for both projects and to coordinate Tribal outreach activities. Since the June 2024 Progress Report, TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp. provided an email update to the Federally Recognized Tribes and the Non-Federally Recognized Tribes with information on recent activities.

As part of the ongoing engagement discussions, the following Tribes have declined participation in the NATCP process and general project engagement:

- Delaware Tribe of Indians

- Delaware Nation
- Chickahominy Indian Tribe Eastern Division
- Cherokee Nation
- Shawnee Tribe

TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp. are open to re-engaging these Tribes upon request at any point as the projects advance. However, the activities described below did not include these Tribes following the point that they declined to participate.

## **2.2 Identification of Potential Project Effects Related to Tribal Interests**

During the reporting period of this Progress Report, OCS-A 0545 – TotalEnergies and OCS-A-0546-Cinergy Corp. did not receive any feedback from the Native American Tribes/Tribal Nations. The Lessees have selected a single Tribal Liaison, Lauren Cleeland with SEARCH, to represent both companies – this will streamline outreach and simplify the process for Native American Tribes/Tribal Nations to provide feedback in the future.

## **2.3 Tribal Feedback on Transmission Planning**

At this early stage of the project, many discussions are introductory in nature and are designed as a starting point to establish relationships with a wide array of stakeholders. As these relationships progress, TotalEnergies will have ongoing opportunities to seek advanced input on specific project elements and will take that feedback into consideration for project planning and design. Discussions on transmission planning have been preliminary in nature and have encompassed the following elements:

- An export cable from OCS-A 0545 – TotalEnergies Carolina Long Bay, LLC, can make landfall in North Carolina or South Carolina
- Landfall location is dependent upon many factors, including distance from project, onshore grid capabilities, and power purchase agreement/interconnection agreement
- Distance to landfall site is a determining factor for the type of cable
  - o High voltage alternating current (HVAC) are used for shorter distances
  - o High voltage direct current (HVDC) are used for longer distances over ~30 miles
- Landfall will utilize horizontal directional drilling (HDD) to bring a cable from several thousand feet offshore directly to a designated location further onshore – thus avoiding impacts to any beach or shoreline.

These preliminary discussions have not resulted in specific feedback.

## **2.4 Anticipated or Scheduled Tribal Engagement Activities**

TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp. will continue joint outreach and engagement with Tribal Representatives in the coming months. The Tribal Liaison will continue to discuss the NATCP with Tribes and incorporate any feedback received as appropriate. Discussions will also include updates on any proposed survey activities, transmission planning and information on buoy deployment as it becomes available. The Tribal Liaisons maintain a list of potential events held by Tribes (and other groups) that will provide an opportunity for in-person discussions and relationship building. TotalEnergies and Cinergy Corp. will also seek input from Tribes on any subsistence fishing activities that may be carried out near the project areas.

### 3.3 Feedback from Parties on Transmission Planning

At this early stage of the project, many discussions are introductory in nature and are designed as a starting point to establish relationships with a wide array of stakeholders. As these relationships progress, TotalEnergies will have ongoing opportunities to seek advanced input on specific project elements and will take that feedback into consideration for project planning and design. Discussions on transmission planning have been preliminary in nature and have encompassed the following elements:

- An export cable from TotalEnergies can make landfall in North Carolina or South Carolina
- Landfall location is dependent upon many factors, including distance from project, onshore grid capabilities, and power purchase agreement/interconnection agreement
- Distance to landfall site is a determining factor for the type of cable
  - o High voltage alternating current (HVAC) are used for shorter distances

- High voltage direct current (HVDC) are used for longer distances over ~30 miles
- Landfall will utilize horizontal directional drilling (HDD) to bring a cable from several thousand feet offshore directly to a designated location further onshore – thus avoiding impacts to any beach or shoreline.

These preliminary discussions have not resulted in specific feedback.
