Executive Summary

This Progress Report is prepared in accordance with Invenergy California Offshore LLC's (Invenergy; Lessee) Commercial Lease OCS-P 0565 (Lease), which requires that Invenergy submit a Progress Report to the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management every six months through the Construction and Operations Plan approval process. This Progress Report covers the reporting period from **December 1, 2025, to May 31, 2026**. In early 2025, federal actions created challenges with respect to regulatory and policy certainty for offshore wind that resulted in Invenergy limiting its development activities as reflected in this Progress Report.

As required by Addendum C, Section 3.1 of the Lease, this Progress Report documents overall project progress and engagement activities undertaken with agencies, Native American Tribes and Tribal Nations (Tribes/Tribal Nations), communities, ocean user groups, and the public over the reporting period, as well as plans for continued engagement.

Invenergy maintains an Agency Liaison, Tribal Liaison, and Fisheries Liaison to direct agency, Tribal, fisheries, and other stakeholder engagement. During this reporting period, Invenergy communicated personnel changes to agencies and Tribes/Tribal Nations. Agency engagement over the reporting period was focused on fulfilling lease requirements in light of reduced development activity. Invenergy had limited direct interactions with the fishing industry; engagement occurred primarily through participation in the California Coastal Commission's Statewide Strategy for the Coexistence of California Fishing Communities and Offshore Wind Energy.

Invenergy will remain engaged and available to share information and maintain open lines of communication as part of its commitment to transparent and responsible development.

1 Purpose and Background

1.1 Purpose

This Progress Report is prepared in accordance with Commercial Lease OCS-P 0565 (Lease), which requires that the lessee submit a Progress Report to the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) every six months through the Construction and Operations Plan approval process. This Progress Report covers the reporting period from **December 1, 2025, to May 31, 2026**. As required by Addendum C, Section 3.1 of the Lease, this Progress Report documents overall project progress and engagement activities undertaken with agencies, Native American Tribes and Tribal Nations (Tribes/Tribal Nations), communities, ocean user groups, and the public over the reporting period, as well as plans for continued engagement.

1.2 Lessee Information

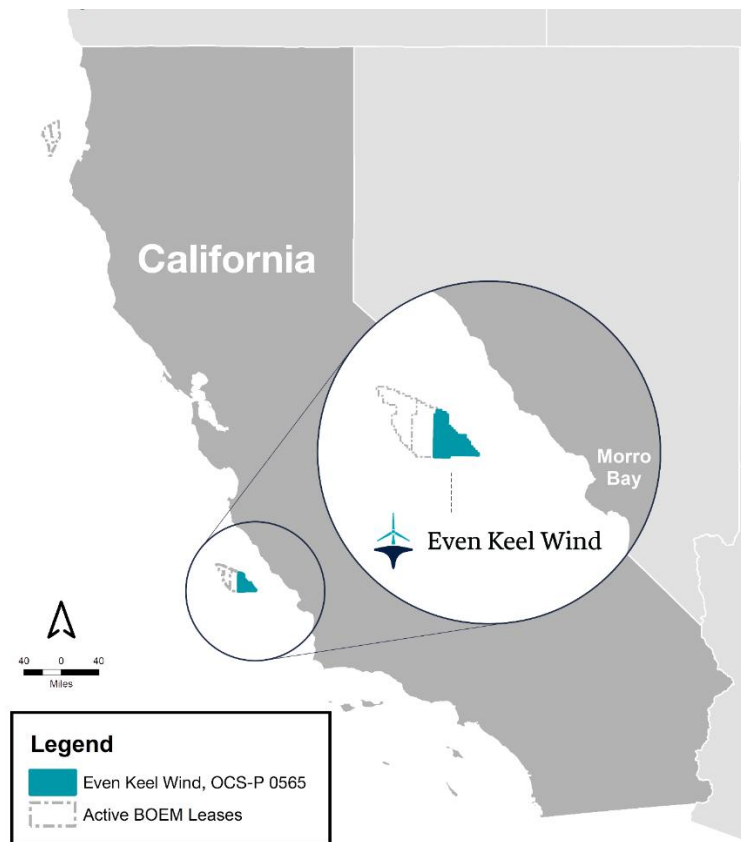
The Even Keel Wind Project (Project) is being developed on Lease OCS-P 0565 by Invenergy California Offshore LLC (Invenergy; Lessee). Invenergy and its affiliates have successfully developed over 220 projects, comprising over 34 gigawatts of energy generation capacity. In addition to the Project, Invenergy is the lead developer of Leases OCS-A 0562 and OCS-A 0567 in the Gulf of Maine and Lease OCS-A 0542 in the New York Bight.

Given federal actions that have created regulatory and policy uncertainty for offshore wind, Invenergy has limited its development activities for Lease OCS-P 0565, which includes external engagement. This Progress Report describes the engagement with Tribes/Tribal Nations, fishing communities, and agencies that has occurred over the reporting period. Invenergy will remain engaged and maintain open lines of communication as part of its commitment to transparent and responsible development.

1.3 Lease Description

Lease OCS-P 0565 was executed on June 1, 2023. The Lease is located more than 20 miles from the closest location onshore and encompasses approximately 80,000 acres of the Outer Continental Shelf. See Figure 1. Invenergy intends to build wind turbine generators and offshore substation(s) on Lease OCS-P 0565, which will connect to California's onshore electrical grid through export cables.

2 Tribal Engagement

This section provides a summary of Invenergy's engagement activities with Tribes/Tribal Nations over the reporting period. Invenergy continues engagement with Tribes/Tribal Nations in accordance with the Central Coast Lessees' Joint Native American Tribes Communications Plan (NATCP). Invenergy works collaboratively with the other two Central Coast Lessees (Golden State Wind and Atlas Wind) to reduce the overall communication burden on Tribes/Tribal Nations. Invenergy has a designated Tribal Liaison (Appendix B) who serves as the primary point of contact responsible for communicating Project information to Tribes/Tribal Nations.

2.1 Overall Tribal Engagement Progress with Tribes/Tribal Nations

Under the direction of its Tribal Liaison (Appendix B), Invenergy had limited engagement with identified Tribes/Tribal Nations over the reporting period. This engagement focused on providing updated contact information, Project administrative updates, and information sharing.

2.3 Tribal Feedback on Transmission Planning

Invenery did not provide Project updates on transmission planning during the reporting period. No export cable route has been proposed for the Project. Accordingly, no feedback regarding transmission planning or export cable routing was received from Tribes/Tribal Nations during the reporting period. Invenery will continue to engage with Tribes/Tribal Nations as the Project’s design envelope is advanced and refined. The Central Coast Lessees’ Joint NATCP acts as the framework for future engagement between Invenery and Tribes/Tribal Nations.

2.4 Anticipated or Scheduled Tribal Engagement Activities

Table 3 includes a summary of anticipated or scheduled engagement activities to be conducted with Tribes/Tribal Nations during the next reporting period, June 1, 2026, to November 30, 2026, which is expected to be minimal.

3 Engagement with Potentially Affected Parties

This section provides a summary of Invenery’s engagement activities with Potentially Affected Parties, including federal, state, and local agencies, as well as fisheries and other stakeholders.

During the reporting period, Invenery had limited engagement with Potentially Affected Parties due to reduced development activity. Engagement was primarily focused on fulfilling Lease requirements, providing administrative updates, and participating in the California Coastal Commission (CCC) Statewide Strategy for the Coexistence of California Fishing Communities and Offshore Wind Energy (Statewide Strategy).

No export cable route has been proposed for the Project and no transmission-planning information was presented to Potentially Affected Parties, including federal, state, and local agencies; fisheries stakeholders; and other stakeholders during the reporting period. Accordingly, no feedback regarding transmission planning or export cable routing was received from these parties during the reporting period.

Invenery maintains a designated Agency Liaison, Tribal Liaison, and Fisheries Liaison (Appendix B) for the Project. During the reporting period, the Project’s Agency Communications Plan, Fisheries Communications Plan, and NATCP were updated to reflect Shannon Stewart as the main point of contact.

3.1 Summary of Federal Agency Engagement Activities

Invenery has continued engagement with BOEM to maintain communications about Lease requirements and Project updates. During the reporting period, federal agency engagement was focused on fulfilling Lease requirements and administrative updates. Invenery held one quarterly check-in with BOEM and had one quarterly check-in canceled because there were no Project updates to communicate.

6 Coordinated Engagement

Throughout the reporting period, the Central Coast Lessees, Invenery, Golden State Wind (OCS-P 0564), and Atlas Wind (OCS-P 0563) have coordinated efforts on Tribal engagement, as detailed above.

The Central Coast Lessees also coordinated with other offshore wind leaseholders through the CCC Statewide Strategy, which was adopted in April 2026.

Invenergy also continues to work with the wider offshore wind industry through trade associations, including American Clean Power, to assess relevant emerging policy and directives and coordinate on appropriate response strategies.
