


Existing and Potential WEAs

- Kitty Hawk Wind Energy Area (WEA) leased by Avangrid Renewables
- Wilmington East and Wilmington West WEAs
- Affirmative letter of support for BOEM's
 Proposed Path Forward for Future
 Offshore Renewable Energy to identify potential additional lease areas for wind energy development (83 FR 14881)







State-led Initiatives

... and Executive Order 80

North Carolina's Commitment to Address Climate Change and Transition to a Clean Energy Economy

Recognizes that climate change is affecting the health and welfare of our residents, economy, environment, and our natural and built infrastructure... that the State must take an active role in combatting climate change and be resilient to its impacts.

Calls for clean energy technology innovations, workforce development, and a modern, smart electric grid to grow the State's economy while making North Carolina a national leader in clean energy solutions.





... and EO 80 (cont'd)



- DEQ: Create NC Clean Energy Plan (Due October 1, 2019)
 - Utilization of clean energy resources and innovative technologies in both public and private sectors, and
 - Integration of these resources to facilitate the development of a modern and resilient electric grid.
- DOC: Workforce Assessments (Due October 1, 2019)
 - Clean energy and clean transportation workforce assessments –
 evaluate current and future workforce needs, assess the skills and
 education required for employment, and recommend actions to help
 North Carolinians develop such skills and education.
